I'm looking around at all these men and women in uniform, the young and the old, the high class and the middle middle class, with plenty of country bumpkins and muddy boots scattered around-all here because Frank was a part of all their lives-he fit in wherever he went. He didn't discriminate. I'm here out of love for his family. For Franks daughter, who took in a stray all those years ago, and all the others who never even raised an eyebrow when I was introduced as her own child. I'm here because I love them, I hurt for them, I grieve with them. I'm trying to do what I thought Frank would have done. I showed up. I'm here.
