Kathryn Verdy Taylor Wiley, a resident of Winnfield, Louisiana and a native of Jonesville, Louisiana died December 28, 2006 at Rapides Regional Medical Center. She was a member and Sunday School teacher at Jonesville First Baptist Church until she moved to Winnfield in 1992. She became a member of Laurel Heights Baptist Church.

Visitation will be Friday night from 5:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. and from 10:00 a.m. until time of service on Saturday at the First Baptist Church of Jonesville.

Her funeral service will be Saturday, December 30, 2006 at 2:00 p.m. at the First Baptist Church in Jonesville, LA, with Brother Lloyd Trisler, Dr. Ralph Webber, and Brother Marshall Douglas. Burial will be at the Graham Cemetery in Nebo, LA. The service is under the direction of Young & Sons Funeral Home of Jonesville, LA.
